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
EARLY MORNING ARRIVALS AT GRUNDY LAKE, ROBERT RUTKAY

The results of the Photographer's Choice (Freeman Patterson Trophy) Competition were announced at the club meeting on October 17, 2023.

The Freeman Patterson Trophy was established in 1978 by the club in recognition of contributions to our club by Freeman Patterson, a Past President and Honorary Life member of the club. The trophy is awarded annually to the single highest scoring image in the photographer's choice of subject matter. The only restriction being no zoology subjects are allowed.

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This year, 26 members entered a total of 101 images. Participation came from six novices, three intermediates and 17 advanced division members. As a comparison, last year there were a total of 124 images by 31 participants. Participation was lower than in previous years. We look forward to seeing an increase in the number of members participating in this competition next year. Remember, the Photographer's Choice competition allows members a great deal of latitude in which images they wish to enter, as it is a chance to compete with images from almost every possible genre (aside from zoology).



Learn what it's like to go storm chasing and some of the challenges inherent in capturing storm images..

In this presentation, Sandra will tell us about the good, the bad and the ugly of storm chasing from the point of view of a photographer. She will explain why, how and when supercells form on the plains of North America, what it's like to go storm chasing, some of the challenges inherent in capturing storm images and show you the colour and infrared images of supercells, lightning, and tornadoes that she captured while travelling with a storm chaser over two seasons.

Sandra Herber is an avid amateur, and award-winning, photographer. She is a librarian in Toronto but she spends all her vacation time (and disposable income)

photographing in Canada and around the world. Sandra was born in South Africa, and has lived in Canada, the U.S., the U.K. and Malaysia. Sandra's love of photography started in her teens when her mother gave her an old Pentax Spotmatic and her parents allowed her to set up a black and white darkroom in the basement where she developed film and made a lot of pretty terrible prints. Sandra switched from film to digital in 2007 and is thrilled that her work has developed enough since those early days to have garnered awards in international competitions and to be featured in publications in print and online.

Using an easy-to-understand, step-by-step approach, he will define and illustrate techniques such as, Long-Exposure Pan/ Tilt, "Multiple-Exposure Monet" (a technique Charles invented), Multiple-Exposure Rotate & Zoom, Soft-Glow Montage and Composite Montage. He will also explain how to use a free script in Photoshop to accomplish this same look, if your camera does not have builtin multiple-exposure capability. You'll learn how to see in new ways and take your photography to an entirely new, mindblowing level! BIO

Charles Needle is an award-winning, Colorado-based fine art photographer, author, speaker and workshop leader with a unique eye for design and artistic interpretation. His popular "Art of Nature" creative macro workshops have attracted students nationwide.

In 2018 and 2021, Charles earned honorable mentions in the Macro and Visual FX categories of the prestigious Annual International Mobile Photography Awards Contest. He was also a semi-finalist in the 2014 Nature's Best Photography Windland Smith Rice International Awards photo contest. In 2011, Charles was selected as a finalist, among 15,000 entries worldwide, in the International Garden Photographer of the Year photography contest, sponsored by The Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew (London, England). This exhibition traveled throughout the United Kingdom.

A popular conference and camera club speaker for more than two decades, Charles has authored three cutting-edge instructional books: Tiny Worlds: Creative Macro Photography Skills (Amherst Media, January 2015), Impressionistic Photography: A Field Guide to Using Your Camera as a Paintbrush (March 2014), and Creative Macro Photography: Professional Tips & Techniques (2011).


