From the Competition Committee, Roger Correia and Anthony Schatzky.


The results of the Fine Art Photography (V.L. Richards Trophy) Competition were announced at the club meeting held on March 19, 2024.

T R A V E L P H O T O G R A P H Y Learn from leaders in the field, learn from other participants

My experience with photo trips.

I started taking photo trips long before I joined the TDPC. On photo trips, one not only visits extraordinary locations and learns from leaders but also from other participants on the tour. In 2015, I used a Canadian company Luminous Landscape (no longer offers travel) and most of the participants were men. I bonded with the only other woman on this trip and for a while we traveled together. While it's great to have a travel partner, you can travel solo with a well-organized photography tour and reputable travel company. Here are some of the tour leaders I travelled with.

One tour can lead to another

The photography world is not that big, so when you start to travel with an organized tour, you meet leading photographers and learn about options for future tours.

SCOTLAND AND NORTHERN SPAIN TOURS

I did a tour with Alistair Benn who lives in Scotland and runs the Expressive Photography group. Alistair Benn is not only an excellent photography tour guide but a superb speaker and instructor for any photography club. His company is also online with workshops: <u>https://expressive.photography/</u>

ICELAND, GREENLAND, AND FAROE ISLANDS

For my tour of Iceland, I travelled with Daniel Bergmann who lives in Iceland, and through him I met Joshua Holko. Joshua is an Australian who specializes in polar regions. I did two of my Greenland trips and the Faroe Islands with Joshua who is an excellent photographer. His company Wild Nature Photo Trips is very well-organized and delivers excellent tours; however it is getting very expensive. <u>https://wildnaturephotoexpeditions.com/</u>

LOFOTEN

Through another photo girlfriend, I was introduced to Wide Horizon Photo Adventure run by two very friendly, and good photographers Edwin Martinez and Noel Casaje. For some reason they don't have a website. They rely on Facebook and word of mouth. It is a small group and relatively less expensive. I recently did Lofoten with them, and plan to do more trips with them in the near future. Edwin could be also a very good speaker for any photography club. DOLOMITES

The only trip run by a woman was my Dolomites adventure. Erin Babnik specializes in the Dolomites, Death Valley, and the French Alps. I did the Dolomites with her in 2018; she's very professional. Jump on the opportunity to take a photography tour

In general, I don't plan my trips far in advance. A lot of well-known photographers are booked at least two years in advance but at my age there is no guarantee that I will be able to participate in two years. So sometimes I learn about an opening, and if the time, location and the price is right, I jump on the opportunity. Being single and retired is beneficial in that respect. I recommend photography trips if you want to see the world, learn from some of the best leaders in the field and participants who share your passion for photographic excellence.

TRAVEL PHOTOGRAPHY

Before you travel, research the area you are going to, look at images online, and think about the equipment you will need to shoot in that area. Get familiar with all the standard classic shots of the most photographed sights, and then try your hardest to return with something different.

PHOTOGRAPHING AT THE BEACH

It is all about the light, try to shoot when the sun is lower in the sky. Try sunrise or sunset, and the moments before and after. If you are unsure about the correct exposure, take one picture at the exposure you think looks best, then take two more photos at either side of that exposure — one slightly darker and one a little lighter. This has some advantages.

- It allows you to capture every detail in a scene.
- It helps you avoid overexposing or underexposing your photos.
- It gives you more options to choose from when you're editing.

Try using a polarising filter to help with the glare. Remember to check your horizon is straight. Return in bad weather and always remember that sand and water can hurt your camera.





T E R R A I N Philip Jessup

Photographic exhibit at The Bob Carnie Gallery 1681 Dundas Street West, Toronto March 4 – April 15, 2024



Nature's chaos is the focus of Philip Jessup's landscape photography. Clashing elements bring out the ephemeral character of natural environments buffeted by climate change and natural disasters in a variety of terrains.


The exhibit features a curated selection of images from the past 20 years. It includes Toronto's ravines carved by receding glaciers; melting Arctic ice shelves; primordial mangroves in Hong Kong's Mai Po Nature Reserve and Mexico's Sian Ka'an Biosphere Reserve; and a Marshall Islands atoll endangered by sea level rise. Very recent images of Iceland's lava fields are also featured.

Jessup created these images using the colour gum over palladium process, which produces gorgeous as well as permanent prints. The process uses ground minerals, tree sap and cotton paper. Each print takes four days to make.

Continuing his life-long work as an environmental advocate, Jessup's photography is his way to show the beauty of these places while signaling a warning that some may disappear forever if we don't take action now.


